## God's Answer to the Three Excuses for Handling Temptation (1 Corinthians 10:13)

**Definition of Temptation:** An enticement presented to lead one into sin against God; The enticement comes in various forms according to the lust of one's heart.

## I. Things to Consider about a temptation:

- A. Every temptation you encounter exposes desires of your heart that have become lusts of your heart. (James 1:14)
- B. Lusts of your heart are desires you believe you cannot do without being satisfied and you are willing to sin to obtain and sin when you do not obtain them; It could be a desire: (James 4:1-3)
  - 1. To be in control that has become a demand
  - 2. To be loved by others that has become a demand
  - 3. To be accepted by others that has become a demand
  - 4. To be understood by others that has become a demand
  - 5. To never be hurt or disappointed by others that has become a demand
  - 6. To be respected by others that has become a demand
  - 7. To be served by others that has become a demand
  - 8. To have personal preferences accommodated at all times that has become a demand
  - 9. To be viewed as competent by others that has become a demand
  - 10. To be approved of by others that has become a demand
  - 11. To belong to someone that has become a demand
  - 12. To be held in high regard by others that has become a demand
  - 13. To be significant to others that has become a demand
  - 14. To be fulfilled by others that has become a demand
  - 15. To be satisfied by others that has become a demand
  - 16. To be valuable to others that has become a demand
  - 17. To maintain a favorable position with others that has become a demand
  - 18. To be secure/safe with others that has become a demand
  - 19. To never be alone that has become a demand
- C. Your in- the -moment response to a temptation exposes whether you are controlled by the Kingdom of God or the Kingdom of Self. (Galatians 6:7-8)
- D. The more you yield to the temptation the more you are exposing a life ruled by the kingdom of self resulting in complicating your life through sinful choices. (Galatians 6:7-8)

- E. The more you resist the temptation and walk in love for God and love for others you are exposing a life ruled by the Kingdom of God resulting in stabilizing your life through godly choices. (Galatians 6:7-8)
- F. The condition of your life is impacted by your response to temptations. (James 1:14-15, 1Peter 5:6-11)

## II. God's Answer and the Three Excuses (1 Corinthians 10:13)

A. Excuse #1 No one can understand or know what I am going through.

*Response*: No Temptation has overtaken you but such as is common to man.

a. There is nothing we face in life that is *original or new*.

b. Every thing we face is common to *human experience*.

- c. Our temptations are not special or *different* from anyone else.
- B. Excuse #2 This is too much for me to handle; I can't deal with this.

*Response*: God is faithful who will not allow you to be tempted beyond what you are able.

- a. God is faithful in that He will always <u>*empower*</u> us to obey Him in times of temptation
- b. God is faithful in that He will not allow your temptation to *exceed* beyond your ability to obey Him.
- c. God is faithful in that He will not allow any person, place, thing or situation to tempt you above your ability to <u>resist sin</u> and obey Him.
- C. Excuse #3 There is no way I can obey God in this situation surely He understands.

*Response:* With the temptation will provide the way of escape also that you will be able to endure it.

- a. God will provide a *way* through the temptation
- b. God will provide *<u>endurance</u>* in the temptation
- c. God's way will be *suitable* for your situation
