

**I. The Mindset of a Servant of God (v1-v5)**

- A. A servant of God knows where they are going (Heaven). (v1)
- B. A servant of God is focused on loving others accordingly. (v1)
- C. A servant of God is aware of their enemies. (v2)
- D. A servant of God knows the parameters of their authority. (v3)
- E. A servant of God does not mind doing the least job in the room, although they may be the one in the greatest authority in the room. (v4-v5)

**II. The Methods of a Servant of God (v5-v11)**

- A. A servant of God serves others in ways that demonstrate humility. (v5-v6)
- B. A servant of God serves others in ways that demonstrate love. (v5-v6)
- C. A servant of God serves others in ways that prepare others for future ministry. (v7)
- D. A servant of God serves others in ways that help others stay in fellowship with God. (v8-v9)
- E. A servant of God serves others in ways that help others walk in holiness with God. (v10-v11)

**III. The Motivation of a Servant of God (v12-v17)**

- A. A servant of God should be driven by the conviction of Christ as Teacher and Lord— knowing what God says is right and that He is in authority over all. (v12-v13)
- B. A servant of God should be seeking to follow the example of their Teacher and Lord in their service to others. (They were to serve one another in way that would keep one another in fellowship and holiness with God.) (v14-v15)
- C. A servant of God should be driven by the fact that they are a slave to God— being ready and willing to obey God's will in serving others. (v16)
- D. A servant of God should be seeking to represent God not self in their service to others. (v16)
- E. A servant of God should be driven by the fact that they will be blessed in the action of serving, not in the knowledge that they should serve. (Knowledge puffs up self but love builds up others.) (v17)

#### IV. **The Ministry of a Servant of God**

- A. Helping unbelievers repent from sin and move into a right relationship with God (Matthew 28:18-20)
- B. Helping believers grow in maturity in faith in Jesus Christ and grow in Christ-like character (Ephesians 4:11-16)
- C. Helping believers repent from sin and mature in fellowship with God (Galatians 6:1-2)
- D. Providing the monetary and material items to believers so that they may function in society as God intended and being willing to open one's home to needy Christians as is deemed Biblically wise to do so (1 John 3:16-19, 1 Peter 4:9)
- E. Providing the monetary and material items to unbelievers in need to demonstrate the character of God to them (Proverbs 19:17)

11. When asked to follow someone else's leadership	Gladly follow spiritual leaders with a spirit of love and joy, encouraging those who lead	Constantly criticize and be cynical and suspicious of them leading
12. When asked to submit to authority	Gladly submit to the authorities God has placed over you	Resist submitting to any authority
13. When asked to step out of your comfort zone	Gladly vacate comfort zones, understanding that Christ's call is not to a life of comfort and convenient	Resist abandoning the comfort zone, not wanting to do anything uncomfortable or inconvenient
14. When asked to forgive someone who has truly offended you	Gladly and intentionally forgive because you have been forgiven of much	Hold grudges and harbor bitterness and anger and feel justified
15. When other people receive recognition and reward	Find joy in their success	Feel jealous and hostile
